POLICY:

Lapeer County Community Mental Health (LCCMH) provides substance use disorder prevention services.

STANDARDS:

- A. LCCMH follows the Administrative Rules for Substance Abuse Services Programs in Michigan.
- B. LCCMH ensures compliance with Region 10 Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) substance use disorder prevention contract and policies.
- C. LCCMH adheres to Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) standards.
- D. LCCMH implements evidence-based prevention programs to fidelity.

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PROCEDURES:

- A. LCCMH completes a prevention services work plan annually and submits to Region 10 PIHP for approval.
 - 1. LCCMH tracks completion toward goals and reports progress to Region 10 PIHP quarterly. Contract amendments are made as needed based on overutilization or underutilization.
 - 2. LCCMH submits a prevention outcome report to Region 10 PIHP annually.
- B. Local schools may request prevention services for identified students by obtaining parent signature for release of information to LCCMH.
 - 1. Once release is obtained, LCCMH prevention staff conducts a basic screening and adds it to the electronic health record (EHR).
 - 2. LCCMH prevention staff schedules individual sessions with student.
- C. The LCCMH Children's Services Program may refer persons served for prevention services.
 - 1. Primary case holder completes the internal referral.
 - 2. The prevention staff complete an assessment to identify level of care and adds it to the EHR.
 - 3. The prevention staff provide prevention services and/or refers to a higher level of care, if indicated.
- D. Child Protective Services (CPS), the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), and/or the local court system may refer individuals for prevention services. Individuals may also be made aware of prevention offerings from their primary case holder, social media, or other avenues.
 - 1. Person served calls LCCMH and expresses interest in prevention program.
 - 2. LCCMH support staff obtains demographic information, enters it into the EHR, and places the person served on a list for the next available session.

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- 3. Person served is provided with the prevention program materials and class schedule.
- 4. If indicated, person served is referred to a higher level of care.

E. Entry/Re-entry Criteria:

1. Person served is willing and able to participate in the program.

F. Exit Criteria

- 1. Person served completes the prevention program.
- 2. Person served transitions to a higher level of care.
- 3. Person served is no longer willing or able to participate in the program. If person served is frequently missing sessions, prevention staff attempt to connect with person served.
- 4. Person served has died.
- G. Discharge
 - 1. Persons served who complete the prevention program are provided with a certificate of completion.
 - 2. Persons served may transition or be referred to a higher level of care.

DEFINITIONS:

<u>Electronic Health Record (EHR)</u>: digital collection of a person's medical information that is stored and accessed electronically.

<u>Fidelity</u>: following the core components, procedures, and structure of an evidencebased program without significant deviations that could compromise its effectiveness.

<u>Substance Use Prevention Services</u>: activities to educate and support individuals and communities to prevent the use and misuse of drugs and the development of substance use disorders.
